BACKGROUND

The case was reviewed on 29 September 2025, retrospective Phase 1 archaeological and paleontological reports were requested, furthermore, the case had to be registered on SAHRIS and a NID (Notice of Intent to Develop) was to be uploaded.

ECPHRA (Eastern Cape Provincial Heritage Authority) COMMENTS in terms of Section 38 of the National Heritage Resources Act (25 of 1999).

This case was tabled at the Archaeology, Palaeontology and Meteorites (APM) Committee meeting held on 8 December 2025 and payment information recently updated.

ECPHRA Final Comment:

ECPHRA acknowledges and accepts the submitted *Heritage Impact Assessment* (HIA) report (Booth, C. October 2025) and the *Paleontological Impact Assessment* (PIA by Wilken, D. August 2025).

Note that the AIA report must reflect that ECPHRA is the responsible authority and not SAHRA, for this project. This should be edited accordingly, as to avoid any confusion. The PIA report standard has improved, and the specialist should be commended.

ECPHRA has no objections to the proposed development, provided that the specialists' including ECPHRA recommendations are adhered to.

A. ECPHRA Recommendations:

ECPHRA General pre/construction phase requirements:

- Submit the EA and *Record of Decision (RoD)* to ECPHRA once issued.

- A Heritage Chance Finds Procedure must be submitted to ECPHRA for approval, before development start and the Fossil Chance Finds Protocol must be adhered to (PIA report, page 27).
- Heritage induction and training for all ground staff including the ECO must be conducted. Proof thereof to be submitted to ECPHRA.

Post Construction phase requirements:

Upon completion of the project, a final heritage compliance report to be submitted to ECPHRA.

Project Payments:

NID fee (R 500 - paid)

HIA fee (R 1 500 - paid)

B. AIA Recommendations page 49:

Development may proceed as planned; however, the following recommendations must be considered before development continues:

1. Portions of the proposed area for development are covered in dense vegetation and sites/features may be covered by soil and vegetation and will only be located once this has been removed. It would be preferred that a professional archaeologist be appointed to monitor the vegetation clearing to identify the extent of the occurrence of possible in situ stone artefacts. The responsibility of the archaeologist will be to monitor the vegetation clearing and record any archaeological scatters and sites that may be uncovered. The decision for collection and possible test-pitting and phase 2 mitigation will be the decision of the appointed archaeologist after assessment of significance during the archaeological monitoring. The cost of appointment and associated activities will be the responsibility of the developer.
2. If concentrations of pre-colonial archaeological heritage material and/or human remains (including graves and burials) are uncovered during construction, all work must cease immediately and be reported to the author of the report and the Eastern Cape Provincial Heritage Resources Agency (ECPHRA) (043 492 1370) so that systematic and professional investigation/excavation can be undertaken. Phase 2 mitigation in the form of test-pitting/sampling or systematic excavations and collections of the pre-colonial shell middens and associated artefacts will then be conducted to establish the contextual status of the sites and possibly remove the archaeological deposit before development activities continue.
3. Construction managers/foremen and/or the Environmental Control Officer (ECO) should be informed before construction starts on the possible types of heritage sites and cultural material they may encounter and the procedures to follow when they find sites.
4. In addition, construction managers/foremen and/or the ECO and/or anyone who may be permanently on-site during pre-construction and construction phases of the project must undergo training before the bush clearing activities starts on the possible types of heritage sites and cultural material that they may encounter and the procedures to follow when they find sites.
5. A Chance Finds Protocol (see Appendix D) for archaeological and cultural heritage finds must be compiled and be readily available for the Environmental Control Officer (ECO) and/or construction manager/s and/or anyone who may be permanently on-site during the relevant pre-construction and construction phases of the project to follow the correct procedures when accidentally uncovering archaeological sites and possible unmarked burials.

C. PIA Recommendations page 23:

The development may proceed with no limitations, on the condition that a palaeontologist is on site during any excavation into solid bedrock. In the unlikely event of fossil material being found during expansion, the Chance Fossil Find Procedure at the end of this document should be followed.

Should important new fossil remains be found the finder should alert ECPHRA (*i.e.* The Eastern Cape Provincial Heritage Resources Authority. Contact details: Ms. Ayanda MaMncwabe Mama 74 Alexander Road, King Williams Town 5600; amncwabe@gmail.com) as soon as possible. This is so that appropriate action can be taken in good time by a professional palaeontologist at the developer's expense. Palaeontological mitigation would normally involve the scientific recording and judicious sampling or collection of fossil material as well as associated geological data (*e.g.* stratigraphy, sedimentology, taphonomy). The palaeontologist concerned with mitigation work will need a valid fossil collection permit from ECPHRA and any material collected would have to be curated in an approved depository (*e.g.* museum or university collection).

All palaeontological specialist work should conform to international best practice for palaeontological fieldwork and the study (*e.g.* data recording fossil collection and curation, final report) should adhere as far as possible to the minimum standards for Phase 2 palaeontological studies recently developed by SAHRA (2013).

These recommendations are summarised in tabular form in Appendix 1 (Chance Fossil Finds Procedure) and should be incorporated into the Environmental Management Programme (EMPr) for the proposed development.
